WORKING HOURS AND ACADEMIC SESSION:

The College imparts in struction in "DAYSHIFT" only. Classes held from 9.00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.The Academic Session starts from April subject to change from time to time as per University and AHSE Council guide-lines.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION: The medium of institution is Assamese and English



ADMISSION PROCEDURE: How to Apply

1. Generally, admission starts after announcement of H.S.L.C. and Higher Secondary Examination results. Prospectus and Prescribed Application Form for admission can be obtained from the Online Portal for FYUGP (SAMARTH e-gov suite) and for H.S. (DARPAN).

2. Selection and admission is made on merit basis only.

3. There is reservation for SC, ST, OBC/MOBC, Physically Handicapped students having proficiency in sports, culture, and NCC as per govt. rules.

 Candidates seeking admission against reserved seats must submit attested copies of relevant Certificates from appropriate authority.
Students willing to offer Major Subject have to face written test/ Interview to be organized by concern Department.

6. Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year, must submit a Gap-Certificate from the Head of the institution, attended last regarding his/her activities during that period.

Selection Procedure

Candidates are selected for admission into H.S. and Degree Course strictly on merit basis subjected to the approval of the 'Admission Committee'. The Admission Committee of the college scrutinizes the 'Admission Forms' and list of selected candidates is prepared on merit basis and the same list is displayed on the College Notice Board prior to the Interview cum admission Process.

Reservation

Reservation for SC, ST(P), ST(H) and OBC/MOBC are maintained strictly as per the Government of Assam rules

Interview cum Admission Schedule

The dates of interview cum admission into different courses are notified on the college notice board, college website. Immediately must have to appear personally before an interview board on date on date original documents, photocopies of which are furnished with the admission form.

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is the most important and vital aspect of any formal education system.

The college always insists on regular attendance of students and they must attend at least 85% classes held during an Academic Session. Students fail to attend minimum 80% of classes held will either be considered Non-Collegiate or Dis-Collegiate and they will not be considered for awarding of Post-Metric-Scholarship.

EVALUATION:

(a) The college conducts sessional tests, unit tests, class tests, terminal examinations for periodic assessment of students. Departmental seminars, group discussion, home assignments are the regular features of the assessment procedure as per Dibrugarh University and AHSEC guidelines.

(b) Final examinations are conducted by the AHSEC and Dibrugarh University.

(c) There is an internal assessment of 20 marks for each paper on a subject for degree courses evaluation of which depends exclusively on attendance, performance on sessional test, home assignment, participation in seminars etc. and good conduct.





LIBRARY:

The college library has fairly good number of book. The library has reference section where-Journals, reference books on different subjects including encyclopedia, question papers of the University and Council are available. The library has separate reading rooms for students and teachers.

One student is provided with two/three books at a time which may be renewed after twenty days, poor but meritorious students duly identified by the college may be provided some more books as per the requirement with due permission.


DISTANCE EDUCATION:

The college is one of the Study Centre of Distance Education under the Directorate of Distance Education, Dibrugarh University for students desire to pursue UG and PG under distance mode functioning from 2012-13 and 2013-14 respectively in Assamese, Economics, English, Education, Political Science and Sociology.



HOSTEL FACILITY:

There are hostel facilities for both boys' and girls' within the collegecampus. Separate application is to be submitted in prescribed form for the hostel admission as per notification. Adequatecare is taken to provide all necessary facilities to the boarders. Allotments of seats are made on merit and distance basis. Students admitted to the hostel shall have to follow hostel rules which will be made available to the boarders by the respective wardens. Reservation procedure will be maintained in allotment of seat. Electricity, permanent lavatory and water supply facilities are available in the hostel.



COACHING CENTRE FOR ENTRY IN SERVICES:

The college has proposed to run a coaching centre for entry in various state and national level services particularly for students belonging to SC/ST/OBC and Minority categories.

COLLEGE CANTEEN:

There is a college canteen within the college campus. The canteen runs under the management/supervision of a committee constituted by the college authority.





COMMON ROOM:

There are separate common rooms for boys and girls. Indoor games and recreation facilities are available in the common rooms.

SCHOLARSHIP:

The following scholarships are available for eligible students of both higher secondary and degree courses.

- (a) National Merit Scholarship.
- (b) State Merit Scholarship.

(c) Post-Metric-Scholarship for ST/SC/OBC/ MOBC students.

Scholars are required to observe strict discipline and regular attendance failing which their scholarship may be withdrawn.

STUDENTS' UNION:

The College Student Union is an elected body of the students. The union carries out programs like games & sports and literarycompetitions under the guidance of professorin-charges.

CAREER COUNSELING AND PLACEMENT CELL :

There is a career Guidance and Counseling Cell in the college headed by a Prof-in-charge to advise students for selecting career opportunities. Students may collect requisite information on job opportunities from the cell.

GRIEVANCEREDDRESSAL CELL:

The college has a Grievance Reddressal Cell headed by the principal to look into the grievance of the students and college employees (teaching and non-teaching)

STUDENT AID-FUND:

As an innovative measures and a part of best practices, the college authority has formulated the "Students Aid Fund" in order to provide financial aid and other assistance to economically back-ward meritorious students.

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

'Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)' is an academic service mechanism as a digital/virtual/online entity established and managed by MOE/UGC to facilitate students to become its academic account holders and paving the way of seamless student mobility, between or within degree-granting Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) through a formal system of credit recognition, credit accumulation, credit transfers and credit redemption to promote distributed and flexible teaching learning.

Academic Flexibility

'Academic Flexibility' is the provision for innovative and interchangeable curricular structures to enable creative combinations of Courses/Programmes in disciplines of study leading to Certificate/Diploma/Degree of study offering multiple entry and multiple exit facilities removing the rigid curricular boundaries and creating new possibilities of life-long learning.

Credit accumulation

'Credit Accumulation' means the facility created by ABC in the Academic Bank Account opened by the students across the country in order to transfer and consolidate the 'credits' earned by them by undergoing 'courses' in any of the eligible HEIs.

Credit recognition

'Credit Recognition' means the credits earned through eligible/partnering HEIs and transferred directly to the ABC by the concerned HEIs.

Credit redemption

'Credit redemption' means the process of commuting the accrued 'credits' in the Academic Bank Account of the students maintained in ABC for the purpose of fulfilling the 'credits requirements' for the award of Certificates/Diplomas/Degrees etc. by the degree awarding HEIs.

Credit transfer

'Credit transfer' means the mechanism by which the eligible HEIs registered with ABC are able to receive or provide prescribed 'credits' to individual registered ABC account in adherence to the UGC credit norms for the 'course/s' registered by the desirous students in any HEIs within India.
