6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

VISION OF THE COLLEGE

The prime vision of this institution is to make itself a Centre of Higher Learning based on high moral value, particularly for the students belonging to under privileged groups which constitute the body of the society surrounding the college by disseminating best possible knowledge and information through ideal academic environment to its stakeholders.

MISSION OF THE COLLEGE

In order to realize these goals in particular, the college, ever since its inception endeavours tireless—efforts towards creating conducive academic environment, both physical and educational, with a group of dedicated teachers, employees and social workers in the decision making body by moulding character of students with high moral quality, honesty, fellow-feeling, co-operation and secularism.

OBJECTIVES OF THE COLLEGE

- (1) The prime objective of this institution is to provide quality education particularly to students belonging to under privileged groups at the undergraduate level.
- (2) The college aims at developing mental and physical capabilities of young men and women by disseminating proper knowledge based on high moral value. Through various activities of NCC, NSS, sports, culture etc. we aim at boosting leadership qualities, personality traits, civic sense and accountability to the community, the society and the nation at large.
- (3) To mould student minds towards career building, creating awareness against social evils by developing scientific outlook, sense of fellow-feeling and secularism among the students.
 - In order to achieve these objectives, the college puts special emphasis on discipline, regularity, punctuality, sincerity, dedication and such other qualities as character, culture and responsibility.
- 6.2 Does the Institution has a Management Information System

Yes. The college administration and Library have been computerised.

- 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:
- 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Curriculum for Degree Courses are designed and adopted by the affiliating university. Although the college faculties are not directly involved in curriculum designing and syllabi development, suggestions are given by the teachers.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

In order to ascertain effective teaching in the class room, teachers prepare lesson plans for each class assigned to them. Students are apprised of the Academic Calendar adopted by the university at the very beginning of Academic Session and instructed to follow it in letter and spirit. Continuous In-Semester Evaluations and feed-backs are taken from students from time to time. Class Seminars, Group Discussions etc. are held regularly. Remedial Coaching is provided to the slow learners. Feedbacks are taken from students, parents, alumni, teachers etc.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

There are two types of evaluation—(1) In-Semester Evaluation conducted throughout the Semester duration and End-Semester Evaluation conducted as per schedule prescribed by the affiliating University. Internal Assessment of 20 Marks in each Course (Paper) are given on the basis of performance in the In-Semester Evaluation for which at least two Sessional Tests, Class Seminars, Group Discussions etc. are held in each Semester. The teachers actively take part in In-Semester as well as En-Semester Evaluations.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college always encourages teachers to undertake research works, projects and for this they are granted leaves. One Minor Research Project has been completed recently and two others are ongoing. The UGC has funded for the projects..

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college has a computerised library with reading room facility. The college has submitted a proposal to the UGC for extension of the existing library building and Women Hostel during 12th Plan to enhance their capacities. Continuous efforts are being made to enrich the library with books, volumes and journals.

A number of computers with internet connectivity have been installed in recent years in order to improve ICT facilities which will enable students to learn basics of computer.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

This college has a small number of teachers and employees to function with a given facilities. Even then, daily works are performed smoothly with streamlining its activities among the teachers and employees. There is a Vice Principal to look after the academic affairs of the College with the Principal in the top of the College Administration. The College administration is aided by one UDA, two LDA and three Grade IV employees. Management of College Library is done by the Librarian and the Library Bearer with committee to advice. Above all, the Governing Body, the decision making management body in the top, is the helm of the affairs.

We have well laid policy for recruitment and upward mobility of faculty and staff. Recruitment is made as per the guidelines adopted by the State Govt. and the U.G.C. There is a Departmental Promotion Committee in each Department that makes recommendation teachers for promotion. Contractual recruitments are also made by the college Governing Body to meet temporary requirements of faculties or other staff particularly at times when the College has to face acute shortage of teachers due to leave granted to teachers on various occasions or due to delay in filling up vacancies on retirement of teachers/staff for various reasons.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The College imparts education in Arts only. With no education in job oriented or technological or professional courses in the College, industry interaction or collaboration is absent.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

Since the college is located in a most remote tribal area, almost all the applicants are generally admitted in the college irrespective of academic performance. So admission of students does not require special arrangement/ policies so far. However, entrance tests are held for selection of students offering Major Courses. There is an Admission Committee consists of all the Head of the Departments and IQAC Coordinator headed by the Principal.

Parents and teachers are directly involved in the decision making of the college, as they have their representatives in the Governing Body and its committees. Further, Parents-Teachers meet is an annual feature of this College which is normally held in the first part of beginning of academic session.

The support staff of the college are often provided short term training organised by the Director of Higher Education, Audit and Account Department of the Govt., the District Administration, University, the U.G.C etc. In the event of massive use of ICT in the college, it is imperative to update knowledge and skills of the support staff frequently. The College also often organises such workshops and training which are mostly relevant to their skill enhancement.

Plantation works, campus beautification works are the routine agenda undertaken by the College family to keep the college campus always greenery. The NSS volunteers, NCC Cadets, Students' Union and Teachers sincerely take part in all these works to keep the College premises beautiful and eco-friendly. The college family organises Safai Abhijan in order to make the campus clean and green in various occasions.
